LIBRARY REPORT:

- Jean Olson gave the following report:
 - o The heat in the Library is now set on 70 degrees
 - o They are putting in new bookcases for the paperbacks hopefully making more room

OLD BUSINESS:

- 1. Santa Update, Jean Olson:
 - o Santa numbers were lower this year; there were 19 children. They all got their pictures taken with Santa, each received a bag of goodies and an age appropriate book
 - o 5 scooters were donated and raffled off to the children who came
- 2. Fish House Raffle Update, Julie Stoeckel:
 - Dave Stefan won the fish house
 - o \$1005 worth of tickets were sold or 201 tickets after costs \$490 was profit
- 3. <u>Christmas Crawl Update Cheire Frick</u>: Overall, the 2014 Christmas Crawl was a success again this year. Feedback from both business owner's and customers was all very positive and encouraging. There were just a few concerns that need to be addressed.
 - 1. A couple of businesses had ice in front of their shops, which is a safety concern for all who are walking on the sidewalks during the crawl. Next year, during the pre-crawl visit, I will encourage retailers to salt their sidewalks prior to the crawl to avoid any slip and fall accidents.
 - 2. It was suggested that we extend the Christmas Crawl hours from the times of 4pm-8pm, instead of the current 5pm-8pm. I would like to keep the hours the same, as this limits the time the store specials will be available and it is a good marketing technique overall, to get people to participate for 3 hours only. There was one individual who, because of her age, was concerned about walking about in the dark. I will speak to her and next year, I certainly can arrange transportation and assistance to any elderly individuals who would like to participate.
 - 3. There were some wonderful ideas proposed for new activities for the Christmas Crawl. Any activity that is added to the crawl should support the overall goal. (See below).
 - A. <u>Remer Christmas Crawl:</u> The Remer Christmas Shopping Crawl takes place approximately 1 week prior to Christmas during the hours of 5pm-8pm. It is a fun, social approach to draw customers from the Remer area and surrounding communities to shop and support Remer

- retailers and businesses. The crawl centers on the idea that buying from our small independent retailers gives shoppers a more unique and personalized experience.
- B. <u>Goal of the Crawl:</u> The overall goal of the Remer Christmas Crawl is to give local business owners a boost in sales during the Christmas Season, and to increase awareness of what our little community has to offer.
- 4. There were a few individuals that had questions about our prize drawings. So, I would like to review what prize drawings are and a few legalities.
 - A. <u>Prize Drawings:</u> Prize drawings are simply a marketing technique to draw customers into each store and to promote our individual goods/services that each store has to offer.
 - B. <u>Legalities</u>: There are both state and federal laws that prohibit the requirement of a purchase or payment of any fee in order to enter a prize drawing. In Minnesota, the State Attorney General's Office states that if we charge a fee or if we require a store purchase in order to register for a prize, it is considered a "lottery." Minnesota Statutes 609.75 and 609.755 make it illegal to sell a chance to participate in a lottery unless we have the legal license to do so.
