LIBRARY REPORT:

Kaara was unable to attend the meeting so her report was submitted & read by M Daugherty: The pancake breakfast over Bigfoot Days served 275 people! Between the pancake & book sale monies collected, they raised \$1037 of which \$416 went to supplies & \$50 of that went to the Chamber. A net total of \$621, just \$17 less than last year! Thank you to everyone who helped with that event. The library received a Little Free Library plaque that they will be placing on the little Bigfoot lending library once they get that re-roofed and painted. Library board meeting is set for Friday July 19 at 9 am.

Waiting on insurance claim to get the roof done.

OLD BUSINESS:

- Bigfoot Days wrap up by Marc Ruyak. Great day for businesses in town. We didn't have all the volunteers we normally do, maybe due to the fact of the 4th being on Thursday. All events went smoothly. The pavilion was a great asset to have access to rather than spend money on a large tent. At the storytelling events, a guest speaker asked how many new visitors to Remer there were in the audience and quite a few raised their hands. Marc is asking that in the coming events, members contribute whether it be monetarily or with volunteering your time at the Chamber events and to realize what these events do for this town. He plans on getting a committee together for statue donations in the coming years. "It won't be easy but it'll be worth it!" Thank you Marc in all your efforts in this event!
- Insurance Update:
 - Received a check for \$8700, partial payment from the insurance company to replace the roof and flagpole. They will send the rest when the work is completed. They are denying the claim for the electrical damage (parking lot lights, deck lights, scrolling sign). Kristian drafted a letter after reviewing our policy, stating we are covered. He will follow up this week.
 - Materials for the parking lot lights & flagpole have been ordered.
- Pavilion Update:
 - Skip reported the work should be wrapping up soon.
 - As mentioned before, Skip was asking for volunteers to help with the project, however, Greg Switala's insurance does not cover volunteer labor.
 - Accessing the pavilion from the depot needs to be finalized

- Reaching out to Operation Round-Up through Lake Country Power to help with electrical installation
- Need to set up some type of reservation system for the pavilion and do we charge a rental fee and/or refundable deposit
- The tables and chairs need to be moved from Bigfoot Days so the workers can finish their job. Marc would take care of that.

NEW BUSINESS:

- Harvest Festival
 - o Pam & Dave Hendrickson said they would be running kids games this year, BIG thank you to them!! Materials needed are available to them from upstairs of the depot. They will be reaching out to the RVFD to donate some small monetary prize money for the kids. Location for the games will still need to be determined. Thoughts of in between the Woodsman & First National Bank, the city park, the Motel front grassy area. The sawdust pile will be wherever the games are.
 - Kids parade will start at 11:45 and the main parade will start at 12:00. Kids theme is "Me And My BFF" (best friends forever) Main parade theme is simply "Harvest Fest".
 - The beer garden and Walt's Bloody Mary bar will be held down at the depot along with the Bethany Lutheran Pancake Breakfast.
 - Denise will be meeting with Lisa from the city about doing the corn feed in the beer garden.
 - Our main goal is to focus on the parade. We want to have the BIGGEST and BEST parade in North Central Minnesota! Letters will go out to other chambers to invite their members to enter our parade.
- Music Festival
 - Scott was unable to attend the meeting. Sponsors are still needed to support the concert. With a \$100 sponsorship, you'll receive 2 free tickets and with a \$300 sponsorship, you'll receive 6 free tickets & that's to BOTH days of music! It's a great couple of days to enjoy some really good music, check it out!
